## Artistic Expressions

- 1. **Writing** Have the students write and design appreciation cards for their friends, expressing gratitude for their friendship.
- 2. **Bake a friendship cake** In small groups or as a class, tell the students the important ingredients needed to bake a cake. Now, have the students "bake" a friendship cake. Have the students write in the middle of a piece of paper (or on the whiteboard) the word FRIENDSHIP. Then have the students write a list of "ingredients" needed to build a strong friendship.
- 3. **Friendship BINGO** Using BINGO cards provided, have the students mark off squares as they identify examples of the friendship-related words or qualities they identify in their own lives.
- 4. **Friendship Interview** —Pair students and have them interview each other about their interests, hobbies, and values to foster understanding and connection.
- 5. **Friendship Charades** Write down friendship-related actions on slips of paper and have students act them out while their peers guess what they're portraying.
- 6. **Friendship Theater** In small groups or as a class, encourage students to write and perform skits or short plays that demonstrate the power of friendship and the importance of empathy and understanding.
- Anchor Chart On a classroom wall, create an Anchor Chart. In the center, have the word FRIENDSHIP. Around the word, have students write characteristics of being a good friend.
